



YOUTH VOLUNTEER EDUCATION PRIZE WINNERS

"Our Brigden Fair Future"



In 2017, \$1000 was designated to be used as an incentive towards a Youth Volunteer Education Prize. As this was the first attempt at this, the rules were simple. The individual (to be eligible) needed to be in a school program and be an active volunteer at the fair grounds. Ballots were designed with the volunteer's name, phone number, age, school/grade, Event/Task they completed, date of event, and # of hours. The chairperson or supervisor was then required to print and sign their name verifying the individual had completed the specific task as required. A few of the student volunteers were present at the 2017 Appreciation night and were called to the stage to be praised for their efforts. Over 800 hours were noted with 74 young volunteers being named on the ballots. These young volunteers had assisted in many different areas from all the aspects of Fair Weekend to assisting with fundraising events, campouts, craft show, catering, fair set up and clean up. They facilitated areas during Agriculture in the Classroom and in the Cultural tent, helped prepare show areas, and brought their enthusiasm to our patrons and the membership.



The four winners announced at the 2017 Appreciation Night received a prize amount of \$250 each. The lucky ballots drawn were Adam Fiddler (Parade Volunteer), Morgan MacRae (Sixth Line Murder Mystery Banquet Server); Emma Ouellette (Funeral Luncheon Volunteer); and Faith Tanghe (Fair Kitchen volunteer).

For 2018, \$2500 has been set aside to continue this program with 10 winners being proposed. We again would like to thank all our volunteers including our youth for all their hard work.
