

I ran for an MAS director position and was elected in 1983; Bruce McCallum was Fair President. Bruce allowed Mary DeGurse and myself to showcase a Limousin steer outside the Jr. Fair Building and have a contest to guess the steer's weight in kilograms! Bruce was not popular with vendors and some of the other directors.

Bob McGee was a great mentor and sowed a lot of seeds to ponder on. I worked with Bob on promoting and building of the Coliseum, and acquiring the Taylor Farm for future expansion. I went with Queenie McBean and Lorene Sharp to sign a \$156,000 mortgage to cover the Coliseum and land purchase. The board had enough faith in me to elect me as President for 1986-1987. The office became a reality with Gwen McBean as Treasurer and Muriel McCallum as Secretary.

Brigden Fair pioneers had the foresight and drive to acquire government assistance to provide infrastructure of buildings that no one else in Lambton County or Ontario had the initiative to do. I thank those past directors, and feel that I have been instrumental in carrying forward their visions by assisting with the constant improvements to be made, and the many upgrades done over my tenure with MAS. Tiling of the property in 1999 was a major hurdle. Exhibition Hall upgrades & renovations, plus hydro upgrades seem to be an annual event. Replacing snow fence barriers as show rings with corral panels, and now construction panels, has simplified set up, safety and tear down. Negotiating a long-term contract with Conklin Shows and now World's Finest Shows has provided stability to both partners, upgrades to the grounds for better public access, and provides a midway that is not seen at any other Lambton County Fair.

I have served on numerous committees and have enjoyed the changes that have been implemented to classes and presentation of exhibits. MAS has supported countless Livestock Breed Classes to accommodate exhibitors to be able to showcase agriculture to our urban neighbours. Partnerships with numerous equipment dealers and Ag businesses have allowed MAS to showcase current equipment and provide hands on experiences for children of all ages.

My family have supported my tenure at MAS and count on spending Thanksgiving Weekend with our Brigden Fair Family!
