# "GOLDEN AMBASSADOR CONTESTANTS"

## **Duncan MacRae**

What can one say about Duncan MacRae.

From potato peeling, to washing pots & pans, to instructing volunteers on how to properly run and clean the automatic dishwasher to storage manager to selling fundraising tickets. Duncan epitomizes the characteristics of an Ambassador. He can be found handing out promotional material every where that he goes – whether the grocery store, doctor's office or anywhere in between. There are very few tasks that Duncan will not take on – if you need straw for the cattle shows or the farmyard – he will make it happen.

Duncan was proud to be President of the Brigden Fair in 1991 and has a lot of stories to tell from those years and the amount of Rain that Mother Nature gifted us with. Along with his wife Donelda, they were awarded the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Service Award in 2005.

A member of many committees including Grounds & Buildings, Exhibition Hall Set up and Take Down, How Does Your Garden Grow and honourary member of the Rabbit/Guinea Pig shows, Duncan is a font of information. For years he has been responsible for oiling the Ploughman, turning on and off the water systems as needed and has now turned over going down into the Water Pit to younger members of the organization. Always an “encourager” of new ideas, Dunc is truly a cheerleader for the fair and its members.

If you are on the fairgrounds and can't find Duncan, he may be undercover as his alter Ego “Windy the Clown”.

Windy the Clown (aka Duncan) started clowning in 1963. From then until 2007, Brigden Fair had two parades - one on Saturday and another on Monday equalling 90 parades. From 2008 – 2024 – he rode his bike thru the parade and the fairgrounds for an additional 15 years not counting the two years (2020-2021) when COVID cancelled the fair.

So in total over, Windy the Clown has graced our fairgrounds for 105 parades and last year (minus the covid years) for a total of 60 years! We hope that barring any health issues, he can continue the tradition. Windy was also honoured to be Parade Marshall in 2013. He is proud to promote the parade clown classes and other classes in the Junior Fair Building.

Whether dressed in his normal attire or as Windy the Clown, Duncan helps make memories for our many patrons.

### **Joan Bogaert**

Joan Bogaert has been a dedicated and enthusiastic volunteer with the Moore Agricultural Society for many years, playing an essential role in the success of the Brigden Fair and various community events. In recognition of her outstanding contributions, Joan, along with her husband Paul, was honoured with the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Service Award in 2015, a testament to her unwavering commitment and service.

Joan served as Homecraft President from 2005 through 2007, providing strong leadership and guidance to the Homecraft Division during her tenure. She has also chaired both the Social and Nominating Committees.

A hardworking and hands-on volunteer, Joan has been an active member of the Exhibition Hall Set-Up and Take-Down team, as well as the Arts & Crafts Committees, ensuring that fair exhibits are beautifully presented year after year. A perfectionist, Joan's creative talents have also been put to good use through her contributions of floral arrangements for fundraising events and banquets, adding a special touch to many occasions.

Joan is always ready to lend a hand in the kitchen, helping with dining room set-up and serving at banquets, as well as pie making and supporting the Fair's tradition of home-cooked hospitality. ### **Jackie South**

Jackie South has been an integral part of the Brigden Fair family for too many years to count. Her commitment to volunteering earned her the OAAS Service Award in 2019 in recognition of her dedication to Moore Agricultural Society.

She has always been a strong voice advocating for the Fair as a Director and also as Coordinator of the Fruits and Veggies building which we all know as "Jackie's Building". She took over this building in the 80's and gave it a fresh and creative flare featuring educational and 4-H displays. Jackie was very involved with the Youth Fair committee of the Brigden Fair and local 4-H clubs enabling them to showcase their displays in her building. As committee chair she led meetings and coordinated the Livestock Achievement Shows at the Fair.

It is always important to Jackie to know that our visitors take away something they don't know about agriculture when they exit the gates until next year. This was the start of Agriculture in the Classroom in Lambton County with Jackie and a group of dedicated volunteers. This event would bring in bus loads of school children who could attend various stations to learn about farm life.

The children and learning experiences were always important to Jackie. Jackie was instrumental in ensuring that the Baby Show continues each Thanksgiving weekend as many adoring parents bring their little ones. As Jackie handed over the reins to focus on other interests, this event has stood the test of time and is still a very popular event attended by capacity crowds.

Her focus was shifted to other committees such as helping organize the Parade, the Town wide decorating contest, participating in the Catering of delicious meals and who can forget Jackie's Diner? This was the beginnings of feeding many hard-working volunteers who could come and rest and get nourishment from soups, sandwiches and even a turkey dinner on Sunday evening. To this day this is the only Turkey dinner many volunteers are able to enjoy on Thanksgiving weekend.

Jackie is currently working hard on maintaining our historical records by putting together photo albums and cataloguing memorabilia. She has worked beside countless other amazing volunteers over the years to bring to the small town of Brigden an event we all look forward to each and every year. We renew acquaintances, share memories and come home each


# Homecraft Division

Each year the different committees like to add new classes or items to their fair offerings while still maintaining our traditional events.


This year a Fair Dance was held the weekend prior to the fair with Scott Manery and the Barn Burners.

There were ducks, chickens and pigeons in the Poultry Barn on Saturday and the Children's & Adult Rabbit & Guinea Pig shows on Sunday.


In front of the Grandstand you witnessed the Aces Flying Pig Races!

Exception will be given for Working Service Animals. Moore Agricultural Society reserves the right to request immunization records while on the grounds.







