- Beets – tops trimmed to ¾" (1.9 cm) above crown & root trimmed to approximately 1 in. (2.54 cm).
- Carrots & Parsnips – tops removed approximately ½ in. (1.27 cm) above the crown & tap roots to be left on.
- Turnips – top & root should be trimmed off.
- Tomatoes – calyx to be removed.
- Onions – trim tops 1 in. – 2 in. (2.54 cm – 5.08 cm) above bulb.
- Peppers – sweet green 4 crown or point with stems of ½ in. (1.27 cm) should be attached.
- **No wax or polish – must be in natural state.**

SENSORY BLANKET/QUILT OR APRONS

Rules & Regulations

- These comfort blankets/quilts or aprons must be durable to be washed many times.
- Blankets or Quilts are best when lap sized...less than 30" in both directions, with about 24" being ideal. A velcro strap to secure to chair is preferred.
- Aprons that are full size are acceptable.
- Patients prefer soft fabrics, especially on the back if not the front somewhere. But there needs to be some stability and for the agitated, weight as well.
- Fabric that is relate-able to their memory age group, things they might love or remember.
- Bright colours are good somewhere in the quilt, but peaceful is good, somewhere in the quilt, too.
- Add on ideas: button, clasps, zippers, ribbons, mesh sewed securely, rickrack, prairie points, lace, and decorative trims. Optional to add pockets.

DIVISION 40 - QUILTS

Rules:

- All entries must be new, clean and up-to-date and made by exhibitor.
- Items can entered one time only.
- Please use safety pins to attach tags.
- The exhibitor will only be allowed one entry per class
- Both creativity and technical skills are considered in judging.

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- **Judges have the full power to place articles in their proper classes and to withhold prize on account of inferiority.**
- **All items must be clean and new or they will not be judged**

ONTARIO ASSOCIATION OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES
ANNUAL **HAND QUILTED** CHAMPIONSHIP QUILT COMPETITION
 ELIGIBILITY, RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Entries must be solely made and quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) to be eligible for this competition.
- Entry quilts must be a minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter (smaller quilts will not be eligible to proceed to the next levels of competition).**
- The winner's name and pattern to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- Upon making an entry into the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Champion Quilt Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- The winning Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Champion Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or Convention OAAS competitions.

Hints on Judging for Hand quilting for OAAS Competition: Quilts should be a minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter, colour coordinated top and back should harmonize, no knots or back stitching, nap running the same way, salvage edge cut off makes for a straighter quilt, have centre panel, no centre seams, binding co-ordinate, invisible stitches - padded to edge, batting should be even, corners mitered or rounded, attractive, no marks of chalk or pencil, no rippled edges, no basting threads, backing smooth, free of wrinkles.

FULL SIZE QUILTS – HAND QUILTED: Pattern named – \$20 \$15 \$10

CLASSES

- Quilt - Cotton pieced (including name of pattern) hand quilted
- Quilt – Preprinted cloth or plain fabric, not pieced (hand quilted and named) quilting judged
- Quilt - Appliqué, Embroidery, or Cross stitch (hand quilted and pattern named)

ANNUAL **MACHINE QUILTED** QUILT COMPETITION
 ELIGIBILITY, RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Quilt must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) Fair to be eligible for this competition.
- Quilt to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches. Note the article can be square, rectangular etc.**
- Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Machine Quilted Quilt will be selected at the Annual Convention of OAAS
- Upon making an entry into the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Machine Quilted Quilt Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- The winning OAAS Champion Machine Quilted Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or Convention OAAS competitions.
- The winner's name to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- Quilt must have visible machine quilting.

MACHINE QUILTED QUILT: Pattern named – \$20 \$15 \$10

- Quilt – Embroidery or cross stitch (pattern named)
- Quilt – Cotton pieced (including name of pattern)

MACHINE QUILTED QUILT SPECIAL
