All exhibitors are required to fill out an Entry Form. Entry Forms must include complete contact information such as: 911 address, telephone number, email, date and exhibitor's signature. Exhibitors under 18 require the signature of a parent/guardian. **Entry fees MUST accompany entry forms.**

\$5.00 per exhibitor on or before **September 25th, 2018.**

\$15.00 per exhibitor starting **September 26th, 2018** (\$5 entry fee plus \$10 late fee).

Any substitutions or additions to entries after September 25th will be charged a late fee of \$10.00.

LATE ENTRIES – ACCEPTED UP UNTIL 4 PM TUESDAY OCTOBER 2ND, 2018 – NO EXCEPTIONS!

Exhibits may be brought into the Fair on **Wednesday, October 3rd, 2018 from 12 p.m. to 8 p.m. and on Thursday, October 4th, 2018 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.** Doors will close promptly at 1 p.m. - judging to begin immediately afterward. Removal of exhibits must take place after 4:30 p.m. on Monday, October 8th, 2018 **(POSITIVELY NO EARLIER or prize money will be forfeited).**

REQUIREMENTS FOR SHOWING:

- Beets – tops trimmed to ¾" (1.9 cm) above crown & root trimmed to approximately 1 in. (2.54 cm)
- Carrots & Parsnips – tops removed approximately ½ in. (1.27 cm) above the crown & tap roots to be left on.
- Turnips – top & root should be trimmed off
- Tomatoes – calyx to be removed
- Onions – trim tops 1 in. – 2 in. (2.54 cm – 5.08 cm) above bulb
- Peppers – sweet green 4 crown or point with stems of ½ in. (1.27 cm) should be attached.

No wax or polish – must be in natural state
