EXHIBITOR ENTRY RULES:

- **NO ENTRY FEE IS REQUIRED FOR THESE SPECIAL DIVISIONS** as they are for charity.
- **All exhibitors are required to fill out an Entry Form and submit to the Brigden Fair Office by September 25th.** Entry Forms must include complete contact information such as: 911 address, telephone number, email, date and exhibitor's signature. Exhibitors under 18 require the signature of a parent/guardian.
- **ALL ITEMS BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE BRIGDEN FAIR for distribution to the charities as indicated.**
- **Late entries** will not be judged or eligible for prize money.
- **Late entries** will only be accepted until 4 pm Tuesday October 2nd, 2018 – No exceptions!
- Exhibits may be brought into the Fair on **Wednesday, October 3rd, 2018 from 12 p.m. to 8 p.m. and Thursday, October 4th, 2018 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.** Doors will close promptly at 1 p.m. as judging is to commence immediately afterward.
- Removal of exhibits must take place after 4:30 p.m. on Monday, October 8th, 2018 (**POSITIVELY NO EARLIER or prize money will be forfeited**).

Rules & Regulations

- A. Quilts will be judged on attractiveness, practicality and durability. OAAS eligibility, rules and regulations do not apply to these classes.
- B. Entries by individuals and/or organizations/groups are welcome.
- C. Quilts may be hand or machine quilted or rag technique.
- D. No tied quilts allowed.
- E. New fabric in any style and pattern may be used. Leftover/scrap bag fabric acceptable.
- F. An exhibitor can enter more than 1 quilt into a class.
- G. Prizes sponsored by Moore Agricultural Society (unless otherwise stated) and awarded to the exhibitor entering the quilt. All items become the property of the Brigden Fair.
- H. ***The quilts will be donated to the Women's Interval Home of Sarnia Lambton after the Fair.***

Rules & Regulations

- A. These comfort blankets/quilts or aprons must be durable to be washed many times.
- B. Blankets or Quilts are best when lap sized...less than 30" in both directions, with about 24" being ideal. A velcro strap to secure to chair is preferred.
- C. Aprons that are full size are acceptable.
- D. Patients prefer soft fabrics, especially on the back if not the front somewhere. But there needs to be some stability and for the agitated, weight as well.
- E. Fabric that is relate-able to their memory age group, things they might love or remember.
- F. Bright colours are good somewhere in the quilt, but peaceful is good, somewhere in the quilt, too.
- G. Add on ideas: ribbons, mesh sewed securely, rickrack, prairie points, lace, and decorative trims. Optional to add pockets.

- E. ***The Homecraft Division is supporting local Optimist clubs to provide the Bluewater Health, Pediatric Unit with pillowcases for children who are admitted to the hospital. Pillowcases are also donated to groups of those in need.***

Brigden Fair is supporting Lambton Public Health for this project designed to increase awareness about the impact of HIV/AIDS in our community.

Rules & Regulations

- A. Knitting or crocheting is acceptable.
- B. Any type of yarn is accepted but the colour **can only be red.**
- C. Any shade of red yarn is accepted but only red, **no other colours added.**
- D. Any style of scarf accepted but must be considered a scarf. No other accessories accepted.
- E. Width of the scarf is limited to a maximum of 14" or 36 cm. Can be any length. Infinity scarves accepted.
- F. If the scarf does not meet the project regulations stated above, the scarf will not be eligible for prize and will be donated to other charities.
